






Bicycle Transportation Information

Many Japanese transport companies will allow you to have your bicycle as luggage providing that it's less than 20kg and no one side exceeds 203cm when it's packed in a protective or storage case. Fees vary by travel provider.

LCC (Low Cost Carriers)[Budget Airlines]

Carrying a bicycle will usually involve an additional charge, as would any large piece of luggage. Your bicycle should be placed in a protective storage case made of a durable material like corrugated cardboard. Be advised that if you do not make a reservation to bring your bicycle on board as luggage beforehand, you may not be allowed to do so.

Transporting your Bicycle by Package Delivery Services

Your bicycle can be moved from your home/accommodation/where you are staying to accommodations at where you intend to ride by commercial delivery companies. If you're going to use this method, it's important to get permission from the place that you will be sending your bicycle to. Not doing so could lead to a refusal to accept the delivery. Always try to inquire in advance.

■ JR (Japan Railways) train lines

You should put your bicycle away in a special bag, and providing it is less than 30kg in weight, and the length, width and height do not exceed 250 cm in total and it is less than 2 meters in length, it can be carried for free on JR train lines. Please note that no more than two pieces of luggage are allowed per passenger.

Things to be aware of when cycling in Hokkaido

Even in summer the temperature can drop sharply in places like high passes in the morning and evening, or when it's raining.

The sun generally sets early, so allow some leeway in your itinerary for times you may want to stop due to noticeable drops in temperature.



There can be heavy traffic and large vehicles on the major highways.

This can lead some cyclists to try and ride only on the prefectural roads, backstreets or the wide agricultural roads that are part of the real charm of cycling Hokkaido. However, unless you have real knowledge of the area, an excellent GPS system or a guide with you, these routes can be challenging to navigate.



When riding in the least populated areas of Hokkaido, it may not be possible to buy food or other supplies for relatively long periods of time.

Bathrooms may also not be available. There can also be regions where it will not be possible to get mobile phone service. Plan your journey with these considerations in mind.



Hokkaido is a treasure trove of wildlife.

However, there can be potential hidden issues when encountering wild animals. Northern foxes carry a parasitic worm called Echinococcus. There are strict restrictions on feeding or touchingt these animals as the parasite is easily transferred to humans, so please refrain from doing

Setting out from Shin Chitose Airport, you'll travel through the Chitose city area, head to Lake Shikotsu and pass though well-known and much-loved destinations such as Lake Toya, Rusutsu, Niseko and Kiroro. Many parts of this course have been featured in the 'Tour De Hokkaido' race, and are therefore perfect for advanced cyclists who desire the additional challenge of riding this course at a faster pace. Of course, less advanced cyclists or those who want to take things at their own pace can enjoy the wide variety of stunning natural

beauty and top quality attractions that this course offers.

Heavy traffic between Otaru and Sapporo could prove difficult for riders who are not accustomed to such conditions. Fortunately, Otaru JR Station offers regular train service to Sapporo JR Station. From Sapporo, you can ride out to other destinations such as Ishikari and Sorachi. There are many hot springs and hot spring resorts on this course. If you have enough space on your itinerary, we fully recommend visiting the Shakotan peninsula.



Many cyclists are drawn to this area by the outstanding natural beauty and riding it is a truly once-in-a-lifetime experience. There is relatively little traffic, the stunning landscapes are limitless, and it attracts many inbound cycling tours from overseas. The start point at Memanbetsu Airport near the Okhotsk Sea, World Heritage site of Shiretoko, Lake Mashu, Lake Kussharo, the

views from Bihiro Pass and the observation point at Mashu are all magnificent. The Koshimizu Flower Garden, Kawayu Hot Spring Resort and the local seafood are all highly recommended. If you have the time or the stamina to spare, you can visit other outstanding locations such as Shiretoko Pass, Lake Saroma and Lake Akan.



Challenge the hills of Mt. Tokachi- one of the most difficult climbs in Hokkaido- if you have the time and the stamina to try it.

This ride offers many special goods, confec-

tionaries, and restaurants where you can try delicious local cuisine. Have a relaxing soak in a wonderful hot spring bath to recover from the fatigue of your journey and enjoy the gorgeous food served there. Road surfaces on this course are of a particularly high quality, so the only possible challenge in this area is the lack of convenience stores or similar amenities along some parts of the ride.



This is a long ride past lakes and the forest of Onuma Quasi National Park - one of the New Three Great Views of Japan - and the beautiful Hokkaido Komagatake. Cycle past refreshing lakes and forests, and then after warming up at Nanae town, go up to the Shirotai Skyline that has an average gradient of 7% and a 600m difference of elevation. Once you reach the top, a panoramic view of Mt.Hakodate and Ono plains are waiting for you. Cycle down the hill through a forest to

Shikabe town, enjoying the refreshing sea breeze. At Shikabe Kanketsusen (geyser) Park, you can relax your feet in the footbath sourced by the geyser water, which spouts every 10 minutes. As you begin pedaling again both Mt. Komagatake and Funka Bay on the coast line to Mori Machi come into view, then the view slowly transitions into the Sawara Flower Road with its colorful flowers. This course offers riders spectacular views and the charm of the "Kan Komagatake Area."







This 86km (Approx) course begins at Sapporo's famous TV Tower and heads towards the Ishikari seashore. 

The Tokapuchi 400 is a 403 km main route that forms a figure eight through the Tokachi Plains in Eastern Hokkaido.

The Tokachi Obihiro Airport is the gateway to the Tokachi Area, with the Hidaka Mountain Range running north to south on the west, and the Pacific Ocean on the east. The area is rich with natural beauty such as the Tokachi River that flows from the mountains to the sea, lakes, hot springs, and much more. The

vast farmland and climate that is characteristic of this area is deeply rooted in the dairy and agricultural industry here, giving the area a name for being the largest food base in the nation. Numerous appealing products typical of the area have been born here and support the livelihood of its residents. The scope of nature and its glorious landscapes here are sure to surprise and excite those who cycle through Tokachi.

Take in the refreshing breeze as the course begins its final stretch as it descends from Sengahara Observatory with the entire Tokachi Plains in sight, and reaches the goal at Roadside Station Urimaku.



Niseko area is a blend of spectacular mountainous landscapes intermingled with plateaus that symbolize Hokkaido. The annual "Niseko Classic," one of the largest amateur cycling races in the nation, is held amidst this resort-like atmosphere. The most prominent course in this area is the 50-kilometer course circling the foothills of Mt. Yotei, the "Mt. Fuji of Ezo." Even beginners can finish the lap in half a day. The first half of the

course is a gentle uphill slope through fields of corn and potatoes.

Cyclists can take breaks along the way at "Fukidashi Park" in Kyogoku or at "Michi-no-Eki Niseko View Plaza" roadside station, and the Roadside Station Shell Plaza Minato in Rankoshi to enjoy fresh spring water and local produce. There are also many hot springs sprinkled throughout the area that are worth checking out.

Kikonai Station is the first station in Hokkaido where the Hokkaido Shinkansen stops. This is where the course begins. Locals in Hokkaido call the southern part of Hokkaido facing the Tsugaru Strait "Donan," which literally means "southern Hokkaido." Of all the regions of Hokkaido, it is the richest in Japanese history and culture; it is truly a dramatic region. The scenery in this region, also very dramatic and diverse, does not pale against the dramatic history of the area. First of all, Mt. Hakodate appears as a floating island on the horizon, with glimpses of Aomori prefecture on the other side of the Tsugaru Strait, and nearer to the Sea of Japan the islands of Kojima, Oshima, Okushiri and Kamome come into

view. Depending on the season and weather, the scenery changes, with the thrilling sound of the thundering ocean when the tide is in, and a beautiful shoreline can be seen scattered with rock formations of all sizes when the tide is out. It can be fun to ride with the breeze along the undulating west side of Hwy 228, as your heart anticipates the next scenery to catch the eye.

Besides the wonderful vistas, the Donan region is also brimming with succulent fresh seafood and blessings of the land that are sure to recharge your energy. As you ride along the main highway, don't forget to take a few side roads and sidestops to add to your enjoyment on this course.



This course is 106 kilometers long and includes opportunities to ride by remarkable scenic attractions such as Lake Kussharo, Mt. Io, and Lake Mashu, one of the clearest lakes in the world. Mt. Io is located right near Kawayu Hot Springs, the starting point for this course, and bursts of steam can be seen coming from the mountain. Just below the steam colonies of Ezo tsutsuji (in the family of rhododendron) bloom in June. There are a number of tunnels made of trees near Mt. Io and Lake Kussharo, and as fall sets in they are transformed into bright colorful tunnels of leaves. A foot bath is the perfect way to take a break and rest.

There are foot baths at JR Kawayu Onsen Station, Mashu Station, and at the Mashu Onsen hot spring village where cyclists can dip their feet in the healing footbath. The first half of the course leading to Lake Mashu is mountainous terrain with an elevation of approximately 670 meters. From the Lake Mashu 1st observation deck, a commanding view of Lake Mashu, Lake Kussharo, the largest caldera lake in Japan, and the Shiretoko Mountain Range rising in the distance can be seen. The 360 degree panoramic view of the "900 pastures" and Lake Kussharo seen from Bihoro Pass are also iconic vistas of Hokkaido.
